REGULAR MEETING

Quincy, Illinois, April 6, 2015

The regular meeting of the City Council was held this day at 7:30 p.m. with Mayor Kyle A. Moore presiding.

The following members were physically present:

The minutes of the regular meeting of the City Council held March 30, 2015 were approved on a motion of Ald. Duesterhaus, as printed. Motion carried.

The City Clerk presented and read the following:

PETITIONS

By the Dogwood 2015 Celebration Committee requesting the following streets be closed for the Dogwood Festival on May 1st from 1:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.: 5th, Maine to Hampshire; and on May 1st through May 3rd from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.: Maine, 4th to 6th; 5th from north side of drive-thru lane of Mercantile Bank to Hampshire; and Hampshire, 4th to 5th, with the 5th & Hampshire intersection closing on a diagonal. They also request "No Parking" signs be posted on April 30th at the close of business with "No Parking" restriction beginning one hour prior to street closing time.

Ald. Holtschlag moved the prayer of the petition be granted and the proper authorities notified. Motion carried.

By the Quincy Area Chamber of Commerce requesting permission to hold the Dogwood parade on May 2nd beginning at 9:30 a.m. starting on Maine at 24th, going west on Maine to 6th, north and south on 6th then disbanding. Line up of the parade will begin at 7:00 a.m. on Maine, 24th to 36th. They request "No Parking" signs be placed on Maine, 6th to 36th, and 6th, Hampshire to Jersey, at the close of business on Friday, May 1st. Rain delays are planned for 11:30 a.m. or 1:30 p.m. as the committee deems necessary on Saturday, May 2nd. Organizers will be responsible for clean-up of city streets after parade.

Ald. Havermale moved the prayer of the petition be granted and the proper authorities notified. Motion carried.

By the City of Quincy 175th Anniversary Committee requesting following streets closed for the 175th Anniversary Dogwood Bash on May 2nd and May 3rd from 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m.: Maine St. from 5th to 8th, Jail Alley in front of the Maine Center and City Hall Plaza parking lot. Music will start at 4:00 p.m. Fencing and an off-duty police officer will be used for crowd control and volunteers will cleanup. Barricades requested and the sound ordinance and open container ordinance be waived.

By the City of Quincy 175th Anniversary Committee requesting Front St., Broadway to Jersey be closed for the 175th Community Church Service to be held at Clat Adams Park on May 3rd from 1:00 – 8:00 pm. Fencing and an off-duty police officer will be used for crowd control and volunteers will cleanup. Barricades are requested and the sound ordinance be waived.

By Calvary Tabernacle requesting to close Hampshire St. from 11th to 12th from 2:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. on May 1st for a Block Party.

Ald. Holtschlag moved the prayer of the petition be granted and the proper authorities notified. Motion carried.

A revocable permit application for encroachment of city right-of-way from Betty Ann Einweck, property owner of 422 S. 8th, requesting permission to block the sidewalk in front of 422 S. 8th periodically during the month of April for roof repair and remodeling to the building's exterior. The Utilities and Engineering Director presents this request subject to five conditions.

By American Legion Post 37 requesting permission to conduct a raffle and have the bond requirement waived from now through 4/20/15. The City Clerk recommends approval of the permit.

She was here to invite the City Council and City Leaders on a VIP Tour as guests of the City with the date to be determined. The second invitation was to allow BYU Performing Group Young Ambassadors to come and participate in a service project with JWCC and do a shortened version of the production they do the first two weeks in June. The Mayor had selected June 13th for that date. Nauvoo will also be in our Dogwood Parade to help celebrate our 175th Anniversary.
