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Awards / Accomplishments / Promotions / Appointments August 2015 Employee of the Month Officer Craig Hufford

Officer Hufford joined the Quincy Police Department on November 26, 2007. He received Police Basic Training from the Police Training Institute, at University of Illinois, Champaign-Urbana, IL. Officer Hufford is a Field Training Officer and a member of the Emergency Response Team. He has been Employee of the Month on four other occasions and was selected by his peers as the 2010 Employee of the Year.

Officer Hufford was nominated for this award due to his proactive work resulting in a felony drug arrest from a traffic stop he made on July 12, 2015. On that date he stopped a pickup truck for a stop line violation at 6th & Jefferson. After making contact with the occupants of the vehicle he recognized them as individuals who have been heavily involved in the manufacture of methamphetamine and the use of other illegal drugs as well. One of the individuals was learned to be an active parolee. Officer Hufford had him step out of the vehicle to conduct a parolee search of his person. As the individual got out of the vehicle, a large baggie containing a crystalline substance fell onto the ground. The subject was immediately taken into custody and the baggie was later examined and found to contain an ounce (28.6 grams) of "Ice" crystal methamphetamine. The subject had over \$400 in cash and 3 cell phones on his person, which were all seized as part of Officer Hufford's drug investigation. He was subsequently lodged on a charge of Unlawful Delivery of Methamphetamine 15-100 Grams, which is a Class X Felony punishable by a Mandatory sentence of 6-30 years in the Department of Corrections. A Parole Violation warrant was also obtained.
