Later that morning at 0243 hours Officer Ebbing took a report in regard to a criminal damage to a vehicle. A subject intentionally drove a vehicle onto a sidewalk, running over two motorcycles and striking a truck. The subject then fled the area. Through Officer Ebbing & Logsdon's investigations, a suspect was developed. With the help of other officers, the stolen vehicle was located in the suspect's garage. Officers tried making contact with the suspect, but were unsuccessful. The suspect eventually came out of the residence and was taken into custody on a \$50,000 meth production warrant. Officers Logsdon and Ebbing worked into the next shift making a case against the suspect and getting him positively identified through photographic lineups.

Due to both officers' tireless investigation, a wanted felon's meth-fueled joyride and crime spree was put to an end.
