May 2014 Employee of the Month

Officer Erica Scott was nominated for this award due to her efforts in locating a wanted person. On 04/01/2014, the WCITF had a subject flee in a vehicle from N 36th and Locust Streets after he attempted to pick up 20 grams of Ecstasy from the USPS. The driver of the vehicle who was identified by officers was located unoccupied shortly after in the area of Crestview and Shirlen Drive. Officers searched the immediate area where the vehicle was located, finding no one. At that point the chances of locating the subject were very slim as witnesses could only provide a general area in which he fled. The subject in the past had been listed as the Crime stoppers Fugitive of the Week and has proven his willingness to avoid arrest by fleeing on foot or in vehicles. Several marked units from the Quincy Police Department and the ACSO began searching the area where the vehicle had been located.

Officer Scott was ending her tour of duty for the day, but took the time and effort to drive through the area to look for the subject. She determined Lind Street to be a logical path that the subject would travel, so she chose that area to search for him. Officer Scott located the subject walking on foot in the area of North 22nd St and Lind St. She took the subject into custody and also observed him throw a small bag of cannabis on the ground.

Officer Scott could just have easily continued to headquarters to end her shift but instead chose to assist with the search. If not for her dedication, the suspect would most likely still be at large, prolonging the investigation. Officer Scott's unselfishness and willingness to assist facilitated the arrest of this subject and took a habitual felon off our streets.
