September 2014 Employee of the Month

Detective Doug McQuern was nominated for this recognition due to his work while investigating a home invasion that occurred on July 21, 2014. On that date two subjects entered a residence with a handgun and baseball bat and robbed a resident of the home. Detective McQuern took lead on the investigation and began interviewing several witnesses. The identification of one suspect was learned fairly early in the investigation. After conducting numerous interviews he came up with a name of the second suspect. After his initial work at the scene, Detective McQuern coordinated with the U.S. Marshalls Task Force in an effort to locate the two suspects.

In the evening hours of July 22, 2014 the U.S. Marshalls Task Force located one of the suspects. Detective McQuern came in and interviewed this suspect and was able to get a complete confession from the suspect who also implicated the second subject. Detective McQuern then continued to work closely with the U.S. Marshalls Task Force who tracked and eventually located the second suspect in Tennessee.

Detective McQuern's diligence in working this case helped take two dangerous felons off the streets in a short period of time. It is this type of work that has made Detective McQuern a valuable member of every unit to which he has been assigned.
