It is with great pleasure I announce that Lieutenant Dina Dreyer has been selected as Employee of the Month for January 2018.

Lieutenant Dreyer began her career with the Quincy Police Department on February 1, 1988. She has a Bachelor's Degree from Sangamon State University. She graduated from the Police Training Institute at the University of Illinois, Champaign-Urbana on May 20, 1988. After working as a Patrol Officer, Lieutenant Dreyer was appointed to the position of Youth Investigator in 1992. In 1995, she transferred to the position of Training and Crime Prevention Officer. Lieutenant Dreyer was promoted to the rank of Sergeant on June 2, 1997 and served as a Patrol Sergeant. In 2000, she appointed to the position of Administrative Services Sergeant. Lieutenant Dreyer was promoted to lieutenant on October 2, 2004, remaining in the same role. On August 1, 2012, Lieutenant Dreyer was assigned to command a patrol shift. She was appointed the position of Investigations Commander in January 2013.

During her tenure with the department Lieutenant Dreyer has been recognized for her work, receiving commendations and accolades. She was selected as the Quincy exchange Club Law Enforcement Officer of the Year in 1997. She was selected as Employee of the Month on two other occasions (July 1993 & December 2006). Lieutenant Dreyer has the distinction of being the first female lieutenant with the Quincy Police Department.

Lieutenant Dreyer was nominated for this award due to her supervisory work and is described as a "fantastic supervisor." She is open minded, listens to suggestions, and supports the officers under her command. Lieutenant Dreyer is always willing to listen to employees' problems and concerns without judgment, whether they be work related or personal in nature. She is always willing to go out of her way to help, leads by example, and is a model supervisor that others should emulate.

Lieutenant Dreyer has served the department in many capacities over the years. Her retirement looming in the not too distant future will be a loss to the department.
