

The following exterior features of the J. Russell Williams House, 2003 Jersey St., are protected by City Ordinance No. 9284, approved December 8, 2015:

- (1) Two-and-a-half story brick Tudor Revival house on limestone foundation.
- (2) Oversized front gable.
- (3) Walls faced with variegated pink brick.
- (4) Porte-cochere with decorative carved timbers, buttressed supports, false half-timbering, and original weather vane.
- (5) West dormer with false half-timbering.
- (6) Decorative buttresses at all corners.
- (7) Limestone corbelling under eaves.
- (8) Arched front entry alcove with limestone detailing.
- (9) Iron balcony over front entry alcove with tinted glass light fixture suspended below.
- (10) Arched ceiling in entry alcove.
- (11) Original arched front door and storm door.
- (12) Original tinted glass and white glass fixtures on front entry, side porch, and porte-cochere.
- (13) Side porch on west.
- (14) Attached brick garage.
- (15) Cantilevered garage overhang with decorative brackets.
- (16) Original copper gutters and downspouts.
- (17) Stone terrace at front.
- (18) Stone terrace at east.
- (19) Casement and double-hung windows in arched or rectangular openings, all facades.
- (20) Leaded window below the eaves at the junction of main block and large front gable.
- (21) Leaded window on west façade with typical Tudor shield motifs.
- (22) Wall-mounted sundial on front gable between first and second story windows.
- (23) False window at peak of lower east gable.
- (24) French doors leading onto east facade.
- (25) Shed-roofed bump-out on east facade.
