PETITIONS

By St. Francis Solanus requesting permission to conduct a raffle and have the bond requirement waived from 4/19/19 to 6/8/19. The City Clerk recommends approval of the permit.

Ward 2 By St. Francis Parish, 17th & College, requesting permission to block off College Ave., 17th & 18th St. and 17th St., Oak and Elm, from noon to midnight on Saturday June, 8th for the annual parish picnic.

Ward 7 By Northside Boat Club, 200 South Front Street, requesting permission to waive Section 111.096 (a) (Consumption and Possession of Alcoholic Liquor on Public Streets, Alleys, and Sidewalks and Lots), Section 111.096 (d) (Permitting open liquor to leave licensed premises) and 111.067(a) Selling Outside of Licensed Premises with proper licenses being obtained on May 26th. Closed area will be fenced off with only one way in and out of the building to the parking lot. There will be live music outside on the parking lot.

Wards 4, 7 By Veterans Parade Committee requesting permission to hold the 12th annual Veterans Day Parade on November 9th starting at 10:00 a.m. at 12th & Maine and ending at 5th & Maine, closing streets on Maine, 12th to 5th.
