

The following exterior features of the John Quincy Adams House, 403 South 16th Street, are among those protected by City Ordinance No. 8777 approved February 3, 1998:

- (1) Wood clapboard siding.
- (2) Overhanging eaves with heavy cornice which includes modillions and an articulated frieze with tightly spaced brackets over sawtooth vertical wood blocks.
- (3) Cornice frieze windows on all facades.
- (4) Full-width front porch with carved scroll wood porch supports and wood railings and large-eaved brackets with modillions.
- (5) Double front door with single transom and pediment.
- (6) Secondary entrance porch on south facade matching front porch with single door, transom and pediment.
- (7) Two-story octagonal bay on north facade.
- (8) Two circular windows framed with hoods on the north facade.
