

The following exterior features of the Frederick and Leondine Reinecker House, 1470 Vermont Street, are among those protected by City Ordinance No. 9347 approved September 25, 2018:

- (1) Two-story brick Italianate house in a cruciform plan on a limestone foundation.
- (2) Limestone water table.
- (3) Low-pitched roof.
- (4) Wide eaves with sets of larger horizontal brackets and scrolled consol brackets below in the frieze band. Pairs of smaller brackets between the larger brackets.
- (5) Short chimney on the west side of the roof.
- (6) Small frieze band windows in the cornice line, three on the west facade, and two on the east facade.
- (7) Four-over-four double-hung sash windows. On the second story there are five located on the north façade, three on the west façade, two on the east façade, and three on the south façade. On the first story there are three located on the north façade, three on the west facade, four on the east façade, and three on the south façade. There are a total of 26 four-over-four windows.
- (8) Arched hoods over all windows on the north façade.
- (9) Front entry with original door, transom window, and sidelights.
- (10) Decorative hood molding framing the entry transom.
- (11) Full-width, one-story front porch with flat roof and overhanging eaves supported by decorative brackets. Low balustrade. Four square columns support the porch. The capitals mimic the curves of the brackets. Pilasters on either end of the porch against the façade of the building in the same style as the columns.
- (12) Small east side porch. Framed door with a transom window overhead. Low railing along one side. One true column, two pilasters.
- (13) Three four-over-four bay windows on the east-facing façade with overhanging eaves decorated with brackets and dental work.
- (14) Narrow one-story porch on east side of rear wing with cut-out brackets at eaves.
