The following exterior features of the Anna Bader Kespohl House, 1632 York Street, are among those protected by City Ordinance No. 9284 approved December 8, 2015:

- 1. Two-story Prairie style house with Tudor Revival details on a limestone foundation.
- 2. First-story walls faced with elongated, buff-colored Roman brick; second story walls faced with stucco and false half-timbering.
- 3. One-story semi-hexagonal bay window on east façade with zipper-brick corners and two classical brackets under overhand. All other windows on original house.
- 4. Two-story squared bump-out centered on west façade.
- 5. Full-width one-story front porch with square brick and wooden supports.
- 6. Original front door and storm door, each with beveled glass lights.
- 7. Shallow one-story squared bay east of front entry.
- 8. Arched lintels with brickwork in keystone pattern over-full length windows on first story.
- 9. Wood belt course at junction of brick and stucco wall facings.
- 10. Soldier brick stringcourse at sill level of full-length windows of first story.
- 11. Hipped roof with flared eaves.
- 12. Four through-the-roof dormers with clapboard siding, each with hipped roof brackets under eaves.
- 13. Two tall brick chimneys with corbelling at the tops. Decorative chimney pots on east chimney.
- 14. Stylistically sympathetic addition and porch at rear.
- 15. Detached two-car garage at rear.
