The regular meeting of the City Council was held this day at 7:18 p.m. with Mayor Kyle A. Moore presiding.

PETITIONS

By Quincy Gems Baseball/Fireworks Authority Inc. requesting permission to hold a fireworks display on June 8th, June 30th, July 2nd and July 3rd at Q-Stadium after the ballgame. The Quincy Fire Department has given their approval.

Ald. Bauer moved the prayer of the petition be granted and the proper authorities notified. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, City Council adopted Ordinance No. 99-26 on April 19, 1999, that established certain regulations governing various aeronautical activities and services at its airport, including self-fueling operations; and

WHEREAS, self-fueling applicant Dean Phillips currently has a self-fueling permit and desires to continue to self-fuel his aircraft from one of the City's underground fuel tanks and agrees to comply with the City's conditions for issuance of a self-fueling permit;

WHEREAS, Mr. Phillips' current self-fueling permit expired April 30, 2018, and he has submitted a request to renew the permit for an additional five (5) years; and

WHEREAS, the Airport Director and Director of Administrative Services have reviewed his request to renew the permit for five (5) years with a one-time fee of \$2,750.00 and recommends the City Council grant such permit;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Airport Director and Director of Administrative Services recommend the approval of the self-fueling permit and authorizes the Mayor to issue the permit to Dean Phillips for a period of five (5) years.

WHEREAS, the City of Quincy is required by a March 1996 United States District Court order to participate in the maintenance of the closed Quincy Municipal Landfills 2 & 3; and,

WHEREAS, the Adams County Quincy Landfills 2 & 3 Superfund Steering Committee has requested payment from the bodies required to participate in the maintenance of this site pursuant to the Quincy Landfill RD/RA Site Participation Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, funding for this obligation is available in the 2018/2019 fiscal year budget; now,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Director of Utilities and Engineering recommends to the Mayor and City Council that authority be given to issue payment to the Quincy Landfills 2 & 3 Superfund in the amount of \$76,000.00.

WHEREAS, in May 2017 the Quincy City Council approved an agreement to transfer Neighborhood Stabilization Program's properties located at 513-515 North 5th Street, 1300 North 5th Street and 1238 North 8th Street to Quincy Housing Authority;

WHEREAS, the U.S. Housing and Urban Development requires the City to perform an ALTA survey of the three properties prior to the transfer;

WHEREAS, the City sought quotes from three survey companies to complete the ALTA surveys;

WHEREAS, the low quote was from Four Points Land Surveying at a price of \$3,770.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council authorizes hiring Four Points Land Surveying to conduct an ALTA survey on 513-515 North 5th Street, 1300 North 5th Street and 1238 North 8th Street to permit the transfer of the real estate to the Quincy Housing Authority.

This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, as provided by law.
