REGULAR MEETING

Quincy, Illinois, February 21, 2017

Monday, February 20, 2017, being a legal holiday, the regular meeting of the City Council was held this day at 7:30 p.m. with Mayor Kyle A. Moore presiding.

The Deputy City Clerk presented and read the following:

PETITIONS

By John Wood Community College Foundation requesting to conduct a raffle and have the bond requirement waived from now until February 22, 2018. The City Clerk recommends approval of this permit.

Ald. Holtschag moved the prayer of the petitions be granted. Motion carried.

By YWCA Quincy requesting permission to hold the 30th annual Kelly's Fun Run/Walk on March 12th beginning at 9:15 a.m. starting at Kelly's parking lot going south on 30th to Maine, east on Maine to Flinn Stadium, back west on Maine to 30th, north to Kelly's Parking lot.
