The city received judicial deed through the Unsafe Building Statue for 1706 Oak Street. The city advertised for sale a fire damaged home hoping a adjacent property owner, contractor or developer would be interested in renovating the single family home. The sale of the property would avoid the city expenses of demolition.

David Waterkotte requested to purchase the home and property for \$100.00. Mr. Waterkotte plan is to renovate the house. Mr. Waterkottee owns adjacent properties at 1708, 1712, 1718, and 1722 Oak Street.

Mr. Waterkottee did execute an agreement for Sale and Redevelopment of 1706 Oak Street following conditions:

- 1. The exterior of the home and property will be cleaned and the structure secured within 30 days of execution of this agreement.
- 2. Removal of the existing fire-damaged roof, stabilization and reconstruction of exterior walls, and construction of a new roof structure, complete with roof coverings, flashings, soffits and fascias roof shall be completed within 120 days of execution of this agreement.
- 3. All exterior doors and windows shall be replaced within 180 days of the execution of this agreement. The interior of the home will be repaired within 18 months of execution of the agreement.

WHEREAS, the city of Quincy received a judicial deed to 1706 Oak Street; and


WHEREAS, the Department of Planning and Development advertised the property for sale located at 1706 Oak St; and

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A SPECIAL USE PERMIT FOR A PLANNED DEVELOPMENT

WHEREAS, Steve Williams did previously file a request for Approval of Conceptual Plan, Preliminary Plat and Final Plat with the City of Quincy, all in accordance with the Ordinances as provided; and,

WHEREAS, said Conceptual Plan and Preliminary and Final Plat have been approved by the City of Quincy, all in accordance with the Ordinances as provided; and,

WHEREAS, all requirements of Chapter 162 (Zoning Regulations) of the Municipal Code of the City of Quincy of 2015 have otherwise been complied with.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to Chapter 162 of the Municipal Code of the City of Quincy of 2015, be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council for the City of Quincy, Adams County, Illinois, that a Special Permit for a Planned Development be and hereby is issued as follows:

SECTION 1. Legal Description: P.I.N.: 20-0-0596-001-00

All that part of the Northeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 9, situated in Township 2 South of the Base Line, Range 8 West of the 4th P.M., Adams County, Illinois, lying West of the West right-of-way line of F.A.P. Route 407;

SECTION 2. Uses: Operate a window tinting business at 1629 South 57th Street; Operate a rental business for solar light tower trailers; Outdoor storage of solar light tower trailers.

SECTION 3: Conditions:

- Solar light tower trailer storage is limited to an area as shown on Exhibit A in the staff report. The identified outdoor storage area is 345 feet by 124 feet (as shown in Exhibit A) or approximately 40,000 square feet and shall be setback 150 feet from the South 57th Street right of way.
- 2. The solar light towers shall not be lit at night.
- 3. Outdoor storage at 1629 South 57th Street is limited to solar light tower trailers.
- 4. The Special Permit for Planned Development is not transferable.
- 5. The outdoor storage of solar light tower trailers is limited to one year, starting September 19, 2020 and ending September 18, 2021.

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A VARIATION FROM ZONING REGULATIONS

WHEREAS, the City of Quincy is a home rule unit of local government pursuant to the provision of Section 6, Article VII (Local Government) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to such authority, this Ordinance is being adopted; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Zoning Appeals of the City of Quincy, Adams County, Illinois, after public hearing and consideration of all relevant factors, has recommended that a variation be granted from the zoning regulations of the City of Quincy, Adams County, Illinois.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF QUINCY, IN ADAMS COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

- **Section 1. PERMIT:** The variation attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference is hereby granted, subject to the applicant recording a certified copy hereof with the Adams County Recorder of Deeds and subject to the applicable provisions of the Municipal Code of the City of Quincy (2015). This Ordinance shall serve as a permit allowing such variation. The real estate to which the variation applies may be occupied and used consistent with such variation, but is subject to all other applicable zoning regulations.
- **Section 2. SAVING CLAUSE:** Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding pending in any court, or any rights acquitted, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, or permits or licenses issued under any act or ordinance hereby repealed or amended; nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this Ordinance.
- **Section 3. REPEAL:** All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance shall be, and the same are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, a police officer's portable radio is an essential piece of safety equipment used by officers more often than any other piece of safety equipment on their duty belt; and

WHEREAS, the Quincy Police Department issues a portable radio to every sworn officer on the department (71) and keeps 5 to 10 radios in reserve for emergency situations or replacement due to damage or loss; and

WHEREAS, an officer's portable radio is vital for communicating with the Quincy/Adams County 911 Center, fellow law enforcement officers, and other first responders during routine calls for service as well as while handling critical incidents; and

WHEREAS, the portable radios currently issued and used by members of the Quincy Police Department were purchased almost 15 years ago and are starting to fail; and

WHEREAS, officers had the opportunity to test the Motorola APX6000 VHF portable radio while on patrol and found the reliability and clarity of transmissions much improved over the current portable radio; and

WHEREAS, the APX6000 portable radio comes with a three year warranty and is capable of accepting upgrades, making it ideal for present day as well as adapting to future needs; and
