REGULAR MEETING

Quincy, Illinois, November 27, 2017

The regular meeting of the City Council was held this day at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Kyle A. Moore presiding. The following members were physically present:

Ald. Goehl, Entrup, Bergman, Bauer, Ernst, Sassen, Rein, Lepper, VanCamp, Reis, Heinecke, Holtschlag. 12. Absent: Ald. Havermale, Farha. 2.

Ald. Sassen moved the absent Aldermen be excused from this meeting. Motion carried.

The minutes of the regular meeting of the City Council held November 20, 2017, was approved, as printed, on a motion of Ald. Ernst. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Quincy is committed to improving the quality of life of its residents including the provision or enhancement of public and specialized transportation services essential for the transportation of its citizens; and,

WHEREAS, Quincy Transit Lines has for the last several years been a member of the Illinois Public Transportation Association (IPTA) and as such member receives valuable services, education, training and representation on matters related to public transportation by this agency; and,

WHEREAS, costs of said services and representation come from annual membership dues paid by public transportation providers throughout the State of Illinois and are calculated on the annual transportation operating costs, excluding capital, from the previous year; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Quincy (Transit Lines) incurred operating expenses last fiscal year in the amount of \$2,702,472, thereby resulting in annual dues assessed in the amount of \$4,400.00 and are payable by December 10, 2017.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Director of Quincy Transit Lines hereby recommends to the Mayor and City Council that Quincy Transit Lines continue its membership in the Illinois Public Transportation Association (IPTA) and that the dues for FY 18 assessed in the amount of \$4,400.00 be paid by the requested date of December 10, 2017

Ald. VanCamp moved for the adoption of the resolution, seconded by Ald. Sassen, and on the roll call each of the 12 Aldermen voted yea, with 2 absent. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, An Act to provide procedures for public notice and hearing on tax and levy increases, approved and effective July 29, 1981, and known and cited as "The Truth in Taxation Act" (35 ILCS 200/18-55 et seq.), as amended, (the "Act"), requires taxing districts, including the City of Quincy, to disclose by publication and hold a public hearing on their intention to adopt an aggregate levy in amounts more than 105% of the property taxes extended or estimated to be extended, including any amount abated by the taxing district prior to such extension, upon the levy of the preceding year; and

WHEREAS, section 18-60 of the Act requires the corporate authority of each taxing district, not less than twenty (20) days prior to the adoption of its aggregate levy (the "Levy"), to determine the amounts of money, exclusive of any portion of that Levy attributable to the cost of conducting any election required by the general election law ("Election Costs"), estimated to be necessary to be raised by taxation for that year upon the taxable property in its district; and

WHEREAS, if the estimate of the corporate authority required to be made as provided in section 18-65 of the Act is more than 105% of the amount extended or estimated to be extended, including any amount abated by the corporate authority prior to such extension, upon the levy of the preceding year, exclusive of Election Costs, section 18-70 of the

Act requires the corporate authority to give public notice of and hold a public hearing on its intent to adopt a levy which is more than 105% of the extensions, including any amount abated, exclusive of Election Costs, for the preceding year.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Quincy has estimated that the amount necessary to be raised by taxation for the real estate tax year of 2017 is more than 105% of the amount extended or estimated to be extended upon the levy of the preceding real estate tax year of 2016, exclusive of election costs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE WHEREAS, the Truth in Taxation Act (35 Illinois Compiled Statutes 200/18-55, et seq.) provides, in part, that not less than twenty (20) days prior to the adoption of the aggregate levy, the corporate authority of each taxing district, including the City Council of City of Quincy shall determine the amounts of money, exclusive of any portion of that levy attributable to the costs of conducting an election required by the general election law, estimated to be necessary to be raised by taxation for the year upon the taxation property in its district; and,

SECTION 1. <u>ESTIMATED LEVY</u>: The City Council hereby determines that the amounts of money, exclusive of conducting an election required by the general election law, estimated to be raised by taxation upon the taxable property of the district for real estate tax year of 2017 is \$5,427,358 which is also proposed "aggregate levy" of the City for such year (that is, corporate and special purpose monies).

SECTION 2. <u>PUBLIC HEARING SCHEDULED</u>: Based on the foregoing, the proposed 2017 aggregate levy is 117.12% of the final 2016 aggregate levy of \$4,631,609.78, and that, accordingly, a public hearing be held on December 4, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. at the City Hall Council Chambers; and notice of said hearing is to be published in accordance with the requirements of the Truth in Taxation Law.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE: This resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage.

Ald. Sassen moved for the adoption of the resolution, seconded by Ald. Holtschlag, and on the roll call each of the 12 Aldermen voted yea, with 2 absent. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Quincy wants the best healthcare program for its employees and would like to continue its healthcare strategy; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Personnel Committee, the Director of Administrative Services, and the Director of Information Technology recommend to the Mayor and City Council that the three (3) year proposal from Quincy Medical Group be accepted.
