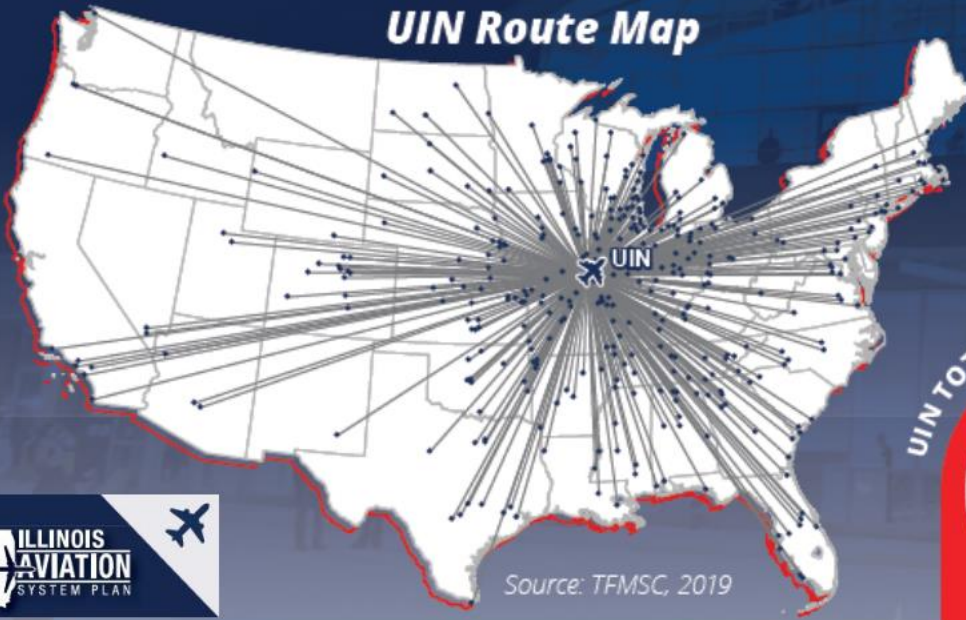
# QUINCY REGIONAL-BALDWIN FIELD

## ABOUT THE AIRPORT

Quincy Regional Airport - Baldwin Field (UIN) is a commercial service airport in west-central Illinois in Adams County along the Mississippi River. UIN is located approximately 12 miles east of the City of Quincy and is owned by the City of Quincy. UIN offers daily commercial flights to Chicago O'Hare International (ORD) and St. Louis-Lambert International (STL) which connects travelers to various domestic and international locations. The Airport supports daily recreational flying activities, aircraft flight testing, and corporate/business flying. The Airport connects businesses in the region, which include manufacturing, distribution, and medicine to markets across the U.S. UIN also supports the community through partnering with Quincy University, hosting the Southern Illinois University Motorcycle Rider Program, and by providing frequent educational tours of the airport and AirUSA museum.

To understand the geographic reach of UIN, the map below illustrates the domestic origin and destination flights into and out of the Airport in 2019.

# QUINCY REGIONAL AIRPORT

- Essential Air Service approved - solidifies Quincy's access to St. Louis Lamber & Chicago O'Hare Airports
- Secured \$15.5M of over \$35M Airfield project.
- Secured \$5.9M for hanger expansion.
- Assisted the City through COVID-19.
- Received \$1M from Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill for Capital.
- Expanded our Aircraft Rescue Firefighting & snow removal fleets.

# CITY INFRASTRUCTURE

- Quincy has repaired or replaced
  - 3.5 miles of streets
  - Over 10,450 feet of water lines
  - 8,250 feet of sewer replacements
  - Multiple curbs & sidewalks
- Total infrastructure investments in 2021- \$13, 023,000. The largest single year street investment in Quincy's history.
- \$6.4M invested into Water Treatment
- \$4.1M invested into Sewer System

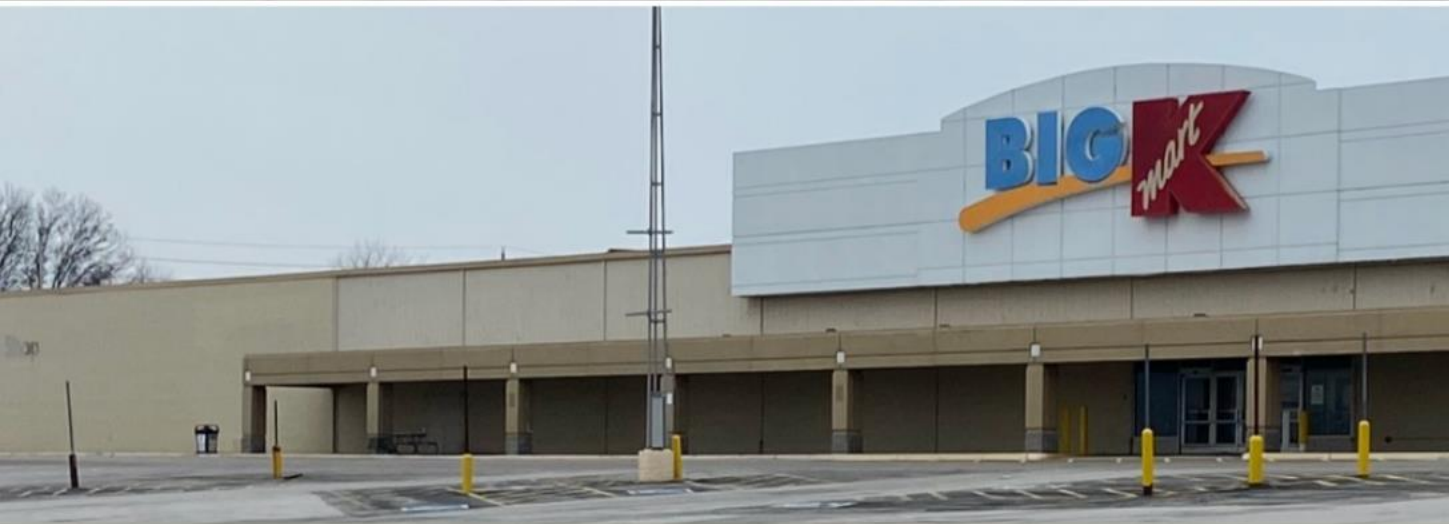




# QUINCY REDEVELOPMENTS
