Special Event Application from Sam Lathrop, Security Director at Quincy University requesting permission to hold Quincy University's Homecoming Parade and Balloon Glow on Thursday, September 22, 2022. The parade will begin at 6:00 p.m. at 18th and Lind Street and will proceed south on 18th Street to Oak Street, turning east on Oak Street to 20th Street lasting less than thirty minutes. The applicant requests that the Quincy Police Department assist with traffic control on the parade route. He requests the closure of 20th Street, College Avenue to Elm Street from 12:00 p.m. (noon) until 10:00 p.m. on September 22nd for the hot air balloon glow and that the City provide barricades for the closure. Council Resolution Authorizing A Loan To The Airport Fund For Payment For Solar Array Project At Quincy Regional Airport. (\$1,213,582 from General Fund to the Airport Fund repaying General Fund over a period of sixteen years.)

Aeronautics Committee and the Interim Airport Director recommending approval to disburse the City Share of the project cost in the amount of \$1,213,582 to Balance Solar Fund XXII, LLC of Long Grove, IL under the prepaid solar agreement.
