Special Event Application from The Crossing Church requesting permission to hold the “Frigid 5K” on Saturday, February 11, 2023. They request the closure, with barricades, of Maine St. from the Crossing parking lot to 54th St. from 10:30 a.m. until 12:00 (noon) on the day of the event and temporary closure of the 48th and Maine intersection as participants pass through the intersection.
