**RIGHT OF WAY**

**Right-of-Way Construction Permit Application.....\$500 + \$0.20/linear foot of project length**  
*Right of way construction permits must be obtained by any utility or telecommunications provider wishing to construct their facilities on, over, above, along, upon, under, across or within City Right-of-Way. This permit is not required by any utility company that pays a Municipal Franchise Fee to the City.*

- i. **Right-of-Way permit administrative fee**
- ii. **Right-of-Way or alley vacation request**

**Revocable Permit Application.....\$30.00 minimum**  
*A Revocable Permit is required for any sign, advertisement, banner, display, awning, and canopy or similar device or object which extends over or is located on City right-of-way. City right-of-way is any sidewalk, street, alley, parkway or any other similar public area in the City of Quincy. Application and approval must be completed prior to right-of-way encroachment. Continuing permits are \$.50/square foot with a minimum of \$30.00. Temporary permits are \$30.00*

**Floodway Permit Application.....No Charge**  
*A Floodway Permit is required prior to any development within a designated floodplain. Development is defined as any man-made change to real estate including grading, filling, utility installation, building construction and fence installation. The floodways are located adjacent to the Mississippi River, Cedar, Emery, and Curtis Creeks and their tributaries.*

### **Site Plan Review.....\$250.00 plus \$10/acre above 1.0**

*A Site Plan Review is required for all multiple family (R3) , commercial (C1A, C1B, C2, C3) downtown (D1, D2, D3, D4, D5) and industrial (M1, M2, M3) projects and any off-premise sign (billboard). All site plans shall be submitted to the Planning office and reviewed by the appropriate city departments. Upon determination that a site plan is in compliance with all requirements the plan shall be approved.*

### **Building Permits**

*Building permits ensure that building construction and materials conform to the provisions of the International Building Code,2006. The purpose of the IBC is to protect public health, safety and welfare by requiring safe construction.*

*Demolition permits ensure that the Quincy Preservation Commission, Quincy Fire Department and the Inspection Office have reviewed a project that is scheduled for demolition in order to protect public interest, health, safety and welfare. After proper consideration by these parties, the demolition may be undertaken.*
